The North Canton Public Library to host event celebrating education for all ages.

NORTH CANTON, Ohio, January 2, 2014 - In response to the North Canton community's desire for educational opportunities, the North Canton Public Library will host a fair celebrating knowledge seekers of all ages from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, January 24. The fair aims to connect community members with the many educational opportunities available to them both inside and outside of the library's walls. Attendees will be exposed to resources that will allow them to learn about the arts, technology, literacy, fitness, cooking, music, finance, entrepreneurship and more.

Both the obvious and not-so-obvious education providers from in and around North Canton will be on-site from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. to share information with library visitors. These include the Stark County Community TimeBank, the North Canton YMCA, WordCamp North Canton, the Canton Hacker and Maker Place and many more. Additionally, four mini-classes will be hosted in the Little Art Gallery throughout the event. These include drum instruction with Elec Simon, upcycled artwork instruction with Pam Neff, "So you wanna be an Entrepreneur" with Joe Rozsa and a 3D printing demonstration presented by the Canton Hacker and Maker Place.

The library's children's department will feature the many educational materials available to families with children of all ages. A list summarizing these materials is attached.

"Education is one of the library's priorities, and this event coincides with the launch of two powerful new continuing education services that are designed specifically for members of public libraries. Beginning January 1, NCPL card holders have access to Gale Courses and Universal Class through the library's website," explained Christina Weyrick, North Canton Public Library community relations manager. Whether library members are looking for college-level, professional development, or personal enrichment courses, they can utilize to these online courses that are accessible anywhere, anytime. Some classes may provide CEU credit (at a fee to the user). During the Connect, Explore, Enrich event, librarians will be available to offer instruction for getting started with these new products.

Borrow one of our many Tag Reader books or games to help make learning to read more fun. (Tag Reader Pen not included)

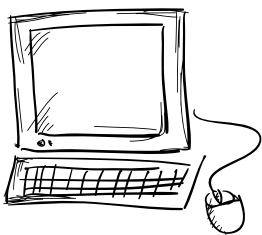
Databases

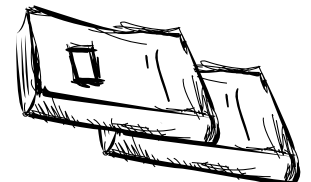
Practice different skills, such as math, foreign languages, spelling and more with our educational flash and activity card sets.
