The Great Courses


The Great Courses is a streaming video service providing lectures from world class professors on topics ranging from math to music to Mayan civilization. Set up an account with RBdigital to get a 7-day pass with unlimited viewing. After 7 days, get a new pass by signing in with the same account information. Accounts can be set up on a computer or through the RBdigital app, available free in the Apple App Store, Google Play Store, or other app store where available. If you already have an RBdigital account set up through the North Canton Public Library to use Acorn TV, use that account.




To access The Great Courses, go to the Digital Video page on the North Canton Public Library website: ncantonlibrary.com/digital-video.

Click on The Great Courses logo.

First, sign up for an RBdigital account by clicking **Create New Account** in the top right of the page. (When you return or if you already have an account, select **Login** and enter your email



and password. The Great Courses must always be accessed through this page.)



In the popup box, enter your entire NCPL **Card number** with no spaces then click **Next**.

In the next popup box, enter your **First Name** and **Last Name**. Then enter your **Email** address and **Confirm** it. Then create a **Password** and **Confirm** it as well. Passwords must be at least 7 characters long and include letters and numbers. Click on **Create Account** in the blue box when you're done.




Now that you have an account with RBdigital, the company that provides The Great Courses, you're ready to **Get Started** learning.



Search results are grouped by Courses, Lectures, and Professors.






When you find a lecture (a single video) or an entire course (multiple lectures) that interests you, hover over it to add it to the **WATCHLIST** for later viewing or click anywhere else on it to find out more information.

At the top of the record for a lecture, you have the opportunity to click the **Play** button video and start watching. Above the video is the name of the lecture and where it falls within its specific course. Below the video is a link to the PDF **Guidebook** that accompanies the course.



Scroll below the video to see the professor and a synopsis of the course, as well as a full course list. Hover over a lecture to find out more about it.





Pause/Play the video by clicking the button in the bottom left of the video. The left pointing arrow with the 10 moves the video back 10 seconds when selected. The speaker icon allows you to adjust the volume and mute the video.

At the bottom right of the video, click the **gear** to select the playback quality if you are having difficulty loading or keeping the

video playing. The out **arrows** allow you to open the video on the full screen of your computer. (When in full screen, the arrows point in and allow you to return to the record view.)

Click your **username** at the top right to **Sign Out** as well as to access **My Watchlist** and **My History**.





Add as many or as few lectures and courses to My Watchlist. Click the **video** or **Title** to be taken to the record for the lecture or course list. Click the **trashcan** to the right of the video to remove it from My Watchlist. Click, drag, and drop the **dots** at the far right to move a Title to a different spot on the list. You can also use either of the blue and white **REMOVE ALL** buttons to clear My Watchlist.

History shows which lectures you have watched and when. The green line at the bottom of the video shows how much of the video has been viewed. Use the **trashcan** to remove a single video from History or one of the **REMOVE ALL** buttons to delete them all.
